## EQUIPMENT LIST

### ALL EXAMINATIONS

- You are expected to provide basic equipment such as biros, lead pencils, rulers and erasers for **ALL EXAMINATIONS**.
- Any equipment brought into the examination room will be subject to **INSPECTION** before the examination commences.
- Equipment should only bear the **ORIGINAL** inscribed information.
- It is the responsibility of the student to supply equipment which is in good working order (this includes calculators). Equipment failure is not a ground for an appeal under misadventure provisions.
- All calculators which are permitted in particular subjects must meet the following criteria:
  - battery or solar powered
  - hand-held
  - silent (except in approved cases for blind students)
  - in addition, calculators which allow modules to be plugged in are permitted only if they meet all the above requirements, and all plug-in modules are removed.

Where the equipment list for any subject includes a scientific calculator, you are expected to provide a calculator which has been approved by the Board of Studies. An approved scientific calculator may be used for any examination where a calculator is listed as required or optional.

Use of slide rules and geometrical instruments is optional.

#### COMPUTER STUDIES

Students will NOT be permitted to take into the examination room any of the following:

- ☐ calculators
- ☐ slide rules
- ☐ drawing boards
- ☐ flow-chart templates
- ☐ charts of character codes, or
- ☐ tables/data sheets

#### ECONOMICS

You must provide the following:

- ☐ a B pencil

The use of an approved scientific calculator is optional.

#### ENGINEERING SCIENCE/INDUSTRIAL TECHNOLOGY

You will be provided with two desks at right angles for additional working space.
