Equipment List – All Examinations

- You are expected to provide basic equipment such as biros, pencils, rulers and erasers for **ALL EXAMINATIONS**.
- Any equipment brought into the examination room will be subject to **INSPECTION** before the examination commences.
- It is the responsibility of the student to supply equipment which is in good working order (this includes calculators).
- **Equipment failure is not a ground for an appeal under misadventure provisions.**
- All calculators which are permitted in particular subjects must meet the following criteria:
 - battery or solar powered

- hand-held
- silent (except in approved cases for blind students)
- in addition, calculators which allow modules to be plugged in are permitted only if they meet all the above requirements, and all plug-in modules are removed.

Where the equipment list for any subject includes a scientific calculator, you are expected to provide a calculator which has been approved by the Board of Studies. An approved scientific calculator may be used for any examination where a calculator is listed as required or optional.

Equipment Checklist for Specific Subjects

AGRICULTURE

You must provide the following:

- ☐ a metric ruler
- ☐ a B pencil
- ☐ a soft eraser
- ☐ an approved scientific calculator

BIOLOGY

You must provide the following:

- ☐ a B pencil
- ☐ a soft eraser
- ☐ a metric ruler

Approved scientific calculators and geometrical instruments are optional.

BUSINESS STUDIES

You must provide the following:

- ☐ an approved calculator
- ☐ a B pencil
- ☐ a soft eraser

CHEMISTRY

You must provide the following

- ☐ a B pencil
- ☐ a soft eraser
- ☐ an approved scientific calculator
- ☐ a straight edge ruler

Use of slide rules and geometrical instruments is optional.

COMPUTING STUDIES

Students will **NOT** be permitted to take into the examination room any of the following:

- ☐ calculators
- ☐ slide rules
- ☐ drawing boards
- ☐ flow-chart templates
- ☐ charts of character codes, or
- ☐ tables/data sheets

ECONOMICS

You must provide the following:

- ☐ a B pencil
- ☐ a soft eraser

The use of an approved scientific calculator is optional.

ENGINEERING SCIENCE/INDUSTRIAL TECHNOLOGY

You will be provided with two desks, set at right angles for additional working space.

You must provide the following:

- ☐ an approved scientific calculator
- ☐ a drawing board
- ☐ T square to suit
- ☐ two set squares (one 45° and one 60°- 30°)
- ☐ set of drawing instruments
- ☐ metric ruler
- ☐ protractor
- ☐ pencils
- ☐ erasers
- ☐ drafting tape/drawing clips/drawing pins.
